

Route Change

Overview: From 2023 the route of the Chiltern Way in the South West of the Chilterns has changed. The route now runs from Stonor to Ewelme via Bix, Greys Court, Sonning Common, Mapledurham, Goring and Woodcote – a total of 35 miles. The route is fully waymarked – NB many of the fingersigns say “Chiltern Way Extension”. There is an overview map on the next page.

You can still follow the old route direct from Stonor to Ewelme, via Park Corner – a distance of 8 miles.

Route Notes

From Stonor to Ewelme

The new route diverges from the old after Maidensgrove. After a steep descent you come to a 5-way junction. For the new route, take the second path from left, through a gate. For the old route turn right on a broad track.

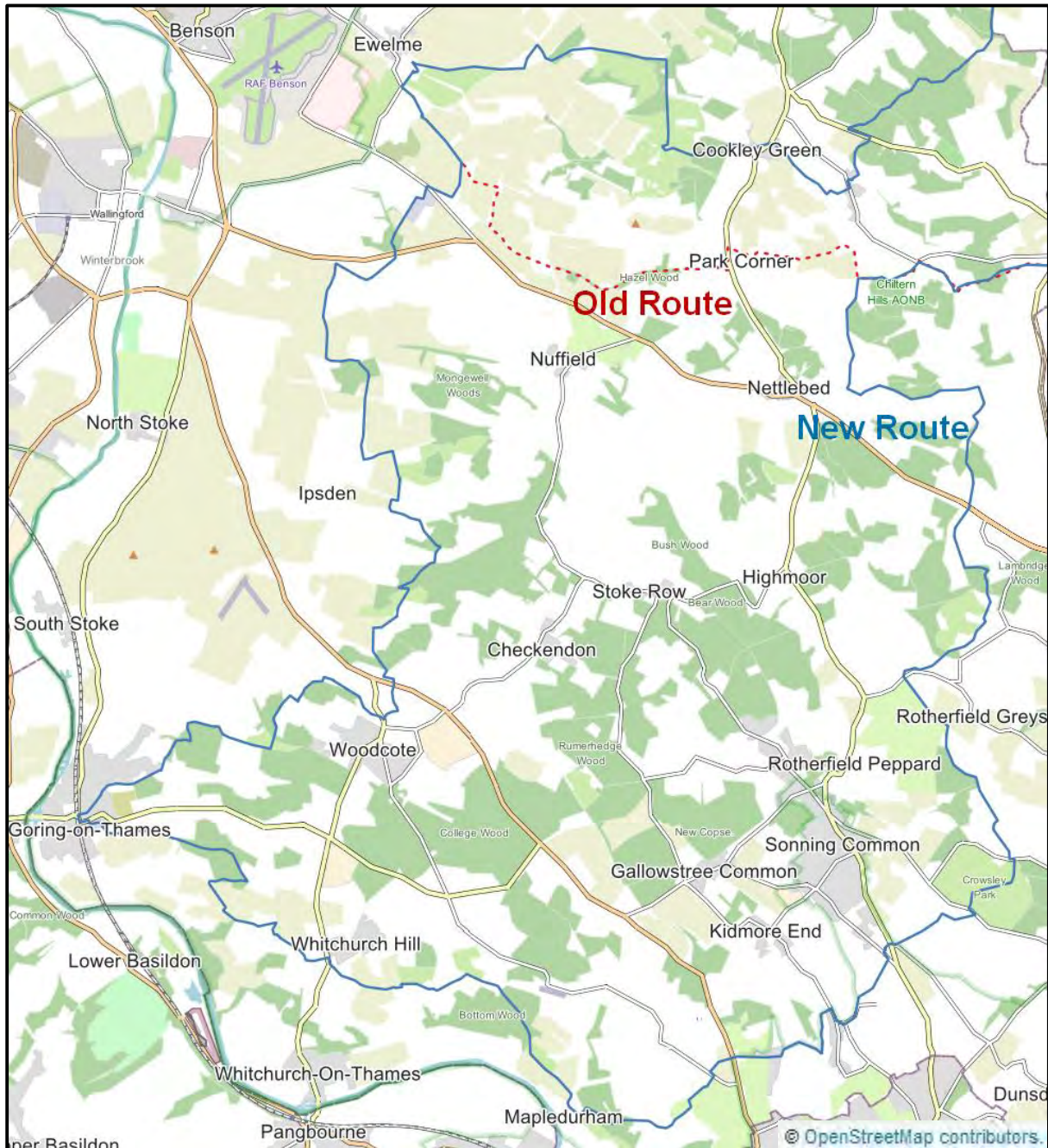
From Ewelme to Stonor

After crossing a minor road, you follow a bridleway along a track - Potter’s Lane. When you come to farm buildings, fork right onto a footpath between sheds and past Potter’s Farm. The old route keeps on a little further past the sheds before bearing left across a field.
